1. Housing Developers/Providers: \$250-\$5,000

Based on units owned/managed/developed in Oregon

2. Public Housing Authorities: \$500-\$15,000

Based on number of housing vouchers administered

1	<1,000	\$500-\$2,500
2	1,000+	\$2,000-\$15,000

3. Nonprofit and Community Orgs: \$50-\$5,000

Includes advocacy, community organizing, social services, homeless services, legal aid, labor unions

Based on organizational budget

Tier	Budget	Dues
1	<\$500K	\$50-\$500
2	\$500K-\$2.5M	\$250-\$1,000
3	\$2.5M-\$10M	\$500-\$1,500
4	\$10M+	\$1,000-\$5,000

4. Community Action Agencies: \$250-\$5,000

Based on population of geographic territory served

Tier	Population	Dues
1	<250K	\$250-\$1,000
2	250K+	\$500-\$5,000

5. Local Jurisdictions: \$250-\$15,000

Based on population

Tier	Population	Dues
1	<50K	\$250-\$1,500
2	50K-100K	\$1,000-\$3,000
3	100K-500K	\$2,000-\$7,000
4	500K+	\$5,000-\$15,000

6. Industry Allies: \$250-\$15,000

Financial institutions, syndicators, technical assistance, construction, architects, real estate

Based on number of employees

Tier	Staff	Non-Profit Dues	For-Profit Dues
1	1-9	\$250-\$1,500	\$500-\$2,500
2	10+	\$1,000-\$10,000	\$2,000-\$15,000
